Accountability Pillar Summary Results Report

Background

The Accountability Pillar surveys are administered annually during the months of January to March to:

- Students in Grades 4, 7 and 10;
- Students in Grades 4 through 9 (small schools);
- Parents of students in Grades 4, 7 and 10;
- Teachers.

Students and teachers complete the surveys online at school while parents receive a copy of the survey by mail and are asked to return the survey directly to Alberta Education by mail. Student responses are grouped within the *Tell Them From Me* survey process. Responses are collected and tabulated into the summary chart released in May and are updated in October to supplement updated academic achievement results through the Provincial Achievement Tests (Grade 6 and 9) and the Diploma Examination results (Divisional and First Nations, Métis and Inuit specific).

Responses to the surveys were received from approximately:

- Responses to the surveys were received from approximately 10 parents, down from 20 last year. Unfortunately, low survey responses may not accurately represent our parent population.
- In Parkland School Division, approximately 298 parents responded to the survey (the five-year average for parent responses is approximately 401)
- In Woodhaven Middle School, approximately 585 students responded to the survey;
- In Parkland School Division: 3,932 Students (1,530 in Grades 4-6 | 1,129 in Grades 7-9 | 1,273 in Grades 10-12)
- 24 teachers responded.

These are approximate numbers as not every student answers every question.

Highlights and Celebrations

- 77.5% of parents, students and teachers were satisfied with the opportunity to receive a broad program of studies including fine arts, career and technology and health and physical education. This represents an increase of 8% over the previous year.
- 86.1% of parents, students and teachers agreed that programs for children at risk are easy to access and timely. This represents a 2.4% increase over the previous year and is the third consecutive year of increased satisfaction in this area. Woodhaven results in this area exceed the provincial average by 2.1%.
- 79.9% of teachers and parents agreed that students are taught attitudes and behaviors that will make them successful at work when they finish school. This represents a 15.5% increase over the previous year, and exceeds the three-year average by 17.8%.

Areas Requiring Strategic Planning

Parkland School Division's Ultimate Goal is Student Success and Well-Being. The Board's Education Plan targets four strategic goals that contribute to the Ultimate Goal:

1. Inclusive Education
2. Quality Learning
3. Culture of Wellness
4. Universal Leadership

Our school's plan for education aligns to the Board's Education Plan.

- 81% of parents, students and teachers agree that students are safe at school, are learning the importance of caring for others, are learning respect for others and are treated fairly in school. While this represents a slight increase of 2.4% from the previous year, it remains 8.5% below provincial average.
- 69.2% of parents, students and teachers were satisfied that students modeled the characteristics of active citizenship. While this represents a modest increase (2%) from the previous year it remains significantly below the provincial average (14.5%).
- The percentage of Woodhaven Middle School students achieving the acceptable standard in Math 6 and 9 remains significantly below the provincial average. Woodhaven Middle School was 9.2% below the provincial average in grade 6 math and 13.5% below the provincial average in Math 9.
